Neuroleadership is a new field of study focused on bringing neuroscientific knowledge into the area of change management, leadership development, management training, education, consulting and coaching.

Proposals are being sought that bridge neuroscience with some aspect of leadership education, scholarship, or development and training.

Proposals should focus on one of the following:

1. PAPER: A short paper to be published in the journal, of 1,500 – 4,000 words.
2. PANEL: A 15 minute panel presentation as part of an overall topic
3. WORKSHOP: A 90 minute interactive presentation, including minimum of 45 mins of workshop or participant interaction time. Note that you may have other people involved in this session as panelists, for example neuroscientists or other experts.

Proposals can be directed to topics in one of three tracks:

PROPOSALS MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

Proposal Title:

Session Objectives: What do you expect the learner to gain?

500-1000 word narrative description of your proposed session: Provide enough detail for a reviewer to understand what you will do.

All proposals should include a cover page with the following information:

- 1) Name of presenter(s), title, organization, mailing address, e-mail address(es) and phone.
- 2) Title of presentation.
- 3) Presentation track: leadership development, systemic change, learning and development.
- 4) Which of the three options you wish to apply for: Paper, Panel, or Workshop. Please put all that you would be open to delivering, and list your order of preference.
- 5) Whether you wish to speak at the Sydney or New York conference or both.
- 6) A 100 word description/abstract (to be used in conference advertising) of the session.
- 7) A one paragraph biographical profile of the presenter(s) for conference promotion.
- 8) Please confirm your willingness for the session to be recorded either audio or video, for distribution via the internet for those who cannot attend.
- 9) Presentation equipment needed, if different from standard. Sessions will come standard with data projector, screen, flipcharts, wireless lapel microphone.
- 10) Evidence of your strength as a speaker, this could be a link to a video posted online, or summary data from participant ratings at other events.

All accepted presentations will have the optional opportunity to be posted on the Neuroleadership Summit website.

All proposals must be sent electronically in MS Word to neuroleadership@gmail.com
Proposals should be formatted in 12 point Times New Roman or Ariel font.

Closing date for speaking applications is Friday March 28, 5pm in your local time.

All presenters must formally register online for the conference but there will be no cost to attend the Summit. Accommodation and travel are at the presenters own expense.
